Dear European EDICs,

As you are all aware, last week was **THE week** for the setting into motion of the **CoFE**, with the **Joint Declaration** signed between the 3 EU Institutions. This means a lot for Europe and for the opportunity of a fresh out-of-the-box thinking about where we are heading for, but it also means a lot to you and to your future activities. Headquarters and Representations will guide you through this major exercise, and we will rely on your sense of purpose and the thorough knowledge of your area for one of the most difficult tasks: reach out, during the CoFE, to those who would normally not be positively involved in EU issues and EU enthusiasms. Unless you do it, no one will. To help you get a foretaste, take a look at the first results of the Special Eurobarometer n. 500 (chapter III on CoFE) to see how people expectations look like. You can easily google it.

Other than this, and looking ahead, this week will be the week of the Commission's proposal on the **Digital Green Certificates** for the movement of vaccinated citizens. Don't miss it because it will spark discussions for sure.

Last but not least, you will have noticed the reply of the Commission over the weekend to Member States lamenting an uneven allocation of doses of vaccines among them. Since Member States decided to depart from the pro rata allocation based on population proposed by the Commission, the latter pointed out that "it would be up to the Member States to find an agreement if they wished to return to the pro rata basis".... this may be food for thought under the health strand of the CoFE, under the angle "division of competences" between the EU and the Member States

The big picture

- Here comes the Conference on the Future of Europe!: On 10 March EP President Sassoli, Prime Minister Costa for the Council and Commission President von der Leyen signed the Joint Declaration setting in motion the Conference on the Future of Europe. The Conference-related events will give people from all walks of life a voice in reflecting on the challenges faced by the EU, with young people playing a central role in the process. Civil society and stakeholders at national, regional and local level, academia and social partners will also be closely involved in the events. Physical gatherings and digital formats will cater for exchange of ideas on the future of Europe in citizens-focused, bottom-up approach. Input from the events will be collected by means of a multilingual digital platform. A feedback mechanism will help feed the ideas shared throughout the Conference into recommendations for EU action. Follow the story, including the Joint Declaration, the backstory and the objectives, as well as the Commission President's speech.
- The future is digital: Digital decade by 2030: On 9 March the Commission presented its vision for a successful digital transformation of Europe by 2030. The vision is critical for the achievement of a climate neutral, circular and resilient economy. The vision follows President von der Leyen's call to make the next years Europe's 'Digital Decade'; responds to the European Council's call for a 'Digital Compass'; and builds on the Commission's digital strategy of February 2020. - The Commission has reached an agreement with BioNTech-Pfizer for the supply of four million more doses of COVID-19 vaccines for Member States in the next two weeks in order to tackle coronavirus hotspots and to facilitate free border movement.
