Dear European EDICs,

Many of you will be back on the 1st of May as "EUROPE DIRECT centres" and for those who will not, a huge word of gratitude will come before the end of the month. The past days have witnessed a lot of talk and comments about the visit of our President and of EUCO President Michel to **Ankara**. While not entering polemics, what happens reveals the dual nature of our Union and makes it at times complex when it comes to projecting the EU identity in the international arena. You have a part to play in explaining to your audiences that this is a Union of both peoples and states: reflecting this may be difficult at times, but this is with no prejudice to the fundamental role the EU plays on global issues and notably under this pandemic. Think for example of the imminent Global Health Summit (Rome, 21st May) strongly wanted by our President von der Leyen. And the Commission has teeth also inside Europe: you probably read in the past few days about the formal letter addressed to AstraZeneca concerning the fulfilment of the latter's obligations.

Last but not least, the **CoFE** approaching: this will span over the transition from this to the next generation, so please keep a close look at the documents on the launch of the online platform (19th April) and of the CoFE itself as addressed by the latest meeting of the CoFE Executive Board. The big picture

In good health: The backstory behind the Global Heath Summit: The Commission has launched a new website about the upcoming Global Health Summit. The Summit, hosted by the Commission and the Italian Presidency of the G20, should take place on 21 May 2021 in Rome. It will be an opportunity for world leaders, heads of international and regional organisations, and representatives of global health bodies to share the lessons learned from the COVID-19 pandemic. They will also develop and endorse a 'Rome Declaration' of principles that should guide future cooperation in preventing and responding to global health crises.

Kicking into high gear: Fresh update on the Conference on the Future of Europe: The Executive Board has endorsed the multilingual digital platform that will allow citizens to contribute to the Conference. It also agreed on its working methods for the inaugural event on Europe Day (9 May). As from 19 April citizens from across Europe will have the possibility to provide their views on any topic that they consider important for the future of the EU. A feedback mechanism will aggregate and analyse key points raised, so that they can also be taken into account during the European Citizens' panels and Conference Plenaries. Citizens will be able to look up events in which they wish to participate thanks to an events map. More.

What's in it for you?

Keep an eye on the launch of the CoFE digital platform and stay abreast of all <u>developments</u> linked to the workings of the Conference, with specific focus on the inauguration event scheduled on 9 May.
